



Tax Attorney Position at CTJ/ITEP

Citizens for Tax Justice (CTJ) and the Institute on Taxation and Economic Policy (ITEP) are seeking an experienced tax attorney to handle both state and federal tax issues.

CTJ is a 501(c)(4) organization that advocates progressive tax policies with a focus on federal legislative issues. ITEP is the corresponding 501(c)(3) organization researching tax fairness issues. ITEP works primarily on state tax issues but also provides research on federal tax issues to CTJ.

Job Responsibilities:

Identify loopholes and tax avoidance schemes in the federal tax code, as well as common state tax loopholes. Write short reports that describe these loopholes and comment on proposed remedies.

Produce short reports (4-10 pages each) addressing highly technical tax issues that are affected by federal legislative proposals or that interest Hill staff.

Identify and analyze federal legislative proposals that would affect states' ability to raise revenue and ensure that all businesses are taxed fairly (like the Business Activity Tax Simplification Act).

Identify proposed state ballot initiatives that would impair funding for vital public services or deliver inordinate benefits to affluent residents and help state partners to educate the public about the potential costs.

Qualifications:

Law degree and at least 3-5 years of experience in tax law or tax policy analysis.

Extensive knowledge and understanding of corporate tax loopholes and tax avoidance schemes.

Ability to write about complicated tax issues in a concise style that is clear and understandable to the public and to Hill staffers.

This position is full-time and based in Washington, DC.
